There is some good advice about approaching prospective members in the new Membership Proposal form which sets out the procedure that must be followed in bringing a future Rotarian into membership of the club. Included in Part B of the form is provision for the nomination of a mentor, whether that be the proposing member or another member assigned to assist with orientation of the new member in the weeks and months following induction. Last week, together, we developed a plan to recruit new members. More importantly we sought to nominate someone to fill the vacancy on the Board for chairperson of the Membership Committee – someone who will monitor the implementation of our plan and keep us focussed on seeking new members. We are grateful that Bob Aston has volunteered to coordinate our efforts, bearing in mind that each of us has the responsibility to reach out to friends, business associates and other community members and find future Rotarians.

I'm sorry to miss our Youth Week speakers (this is one of my stay-at-home nights) – I'm sure that they will leave you with the impression that the future is in good hands. Jeremy is chairperson for tonight's meeting and I expect that he will clear your minds for the challenge ahead – the Cinders!

Last Thursday night's board meeting covered a varied journey of information some of which was resolved and some to be followed up. Apologies from Marilyn Gibson who is on leave.

The minutes from last months' meeting were accepted without amendment.

- ✓ Bob Antill reported on the request to Council about getting extra garbage bins at the markets. Council reported back that it was our responsibility and we must remove garbage to the tip, as part of our lease agreement with them. Stall holders will be notified of the need to remove their own rubbish and we must make sure we check the grounds and remove rubbish at the close of the markets.
- ✓ A letter of congratulations will be sent to the RYDA committee at the Bay for their successful running of the program.
- ✓ Jack was to look up where our Shelter Boxes are, and make sure that we have been credited for each.
- ✓ Requests for a donation for the South Coast & Monaro Social Science Teachers' Association was not accepted as was a request for funding from Little Athletics. Both did not appear to meet the Club's requirements.
- ✓ Treasures report was accepted and passed without alteration.
- ✓ All members were urged to continue their support for the Foundation and keep making their weekly contributions.
- ✓ Youth exchange is still being considered but we need a commitment from members to be host families or suitable families outside the Rotary community.
- ✓ Youth Week will have two young people talking to us on the 15<sup>th</sup> (tonight)
- ✓ Public Relations – Laurelle reported on two articles she wrote for the Narooma News that were published on Bowlescan.
- ✓ Presentation of cheques \$2,000 to Cycleway committee & \$500 to St John Ambulance.
