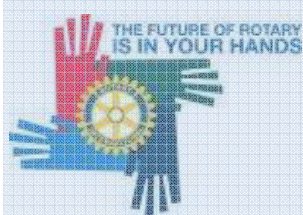

# JACK'S JOURNAL

A modest market result last Sunday, \$1,054.90 all up. Gate takings were less than they could have been because stallholders who were "rained off" the previous market were not charged site fees at this market. Fewer bookings also required some adjustments to the usual layout so that the market would not appear too widely scattered over the oval.

Laurelle has prepared a submission to Council on the Club's behalf on the draft Recreation and Open Space Strategy which Ian and I have approved. Submissions close on Friday. It is to guide planning, development, management and use through the next 20 years.

There is a trend to consolidate facilities such as tennis courts and playgrounds resulting in recommendations for the removal of the Dalmeny Tennis Courts and the Walker Park playground in Narooma, with which we do not agree. Regarding NATA Oval, there is a recommendation to fence it entirely and provide shelters. We want the area kept as a flexible open space and not restricted by shelters. We have supported these recommendations to improve facilities at Dalmeny Sports Oval, to prepare a new master plan for Apex Park and provide a regional playground facility there, and expand Narooma tennis courts and clubhouse.

We have received a request from Can Assist for a mailing list of members to whom it wants to send an appeal for funds to support country families affected by cancer. We will not be disclosing members' addresses to them, however if any of you are individually interested in helping this worthy cause, please contact Can Assist directly: 35-39 Mountain Street, Ultimo, and NSW 2007.

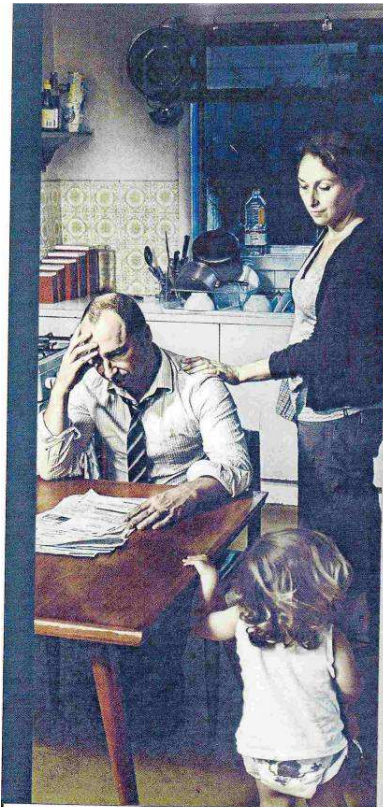
