During a flood in a small town, a young girl was perched on top of a house with a little boy.

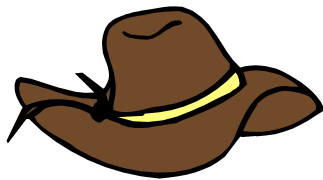
As they sat watching articles float by in the water, they noticed an old sweat-stained hat go past.

"At the risk of being labelled a heretic, 1918, for instance, saw two cyclones kill more than a hundred people in North Queensland; both were more intense than Cyclone Yasi. There were record floods in eastern Australia, including the great Rockhampton flood that saw the Fitzroy River rise to its highest level.

There were notable floods also in New Zealand, Germany, England, and Africa. Meanwhile, heatwaves swept Australia (Sydney, Victoria, Perth and Brisbane) and Pennsylvania; and droughts occurred in Australia, Norway, India, North America, Brazil and Africa. Blizzards affected the Eastern United States with the "coldest weather in history."

There were also snowstorms in New Zealand, Argentina and in Europe, and tornadoes destroyed towns in the US. Space limits a wider examination, but I think readers will get the point without needing to mention the extraordinary weather events of 1893, 1927 or 1934. Sadly for some, with no appreciation of History, the sky will always be falling in"
