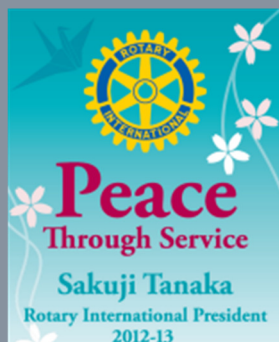

The Week That Was

Ben Potter a Narooma High student and member of the Eurobodalla Youth Committee spoke on the role of the committee as well as activities and projects planned to assist our young people. Ben mentioned the age old problem for the shire – lack of public transport to move about the three major towns as well as transporting people home safely late at night – I am not sure if we will be able to tackle the transport problem.

Ben also spoke about a sticker the Committee hopes to launch soon – The idea is that it discretely placed on a person’s back if they propose to walk home late at night after a party – the sticker is fluorescent making it easier to see someone the road.
