Trevor Smith's talk 2 Oct 2014 - PAINTING WITH OILS



Recently moved to Narooma , Trevor gave an interesting insight into his art and treated us to a lovely display of many special colourful prints of his work last night. Scenes and portraits painted were inspired by his extensive travels to many places in Australia and overseas. Trevor said over time he developed a style similar to the Impressionists and loves to make things aesthetically beautiful and 'durable'. Yes, he admits it's a strange word to use for fine art but he wants his art to endure.

Trevor's move here from Sydney has prompted him on another adventure - to take on his art as a full time professional. Some of his original pieces will be on display at our SoArt Gallery over the Australia Day weekend 2015.

His background for most of his life was accounting/bookkeeping and although he dabbled with paints at school it was many years later that his talent became apparent, following studies at the well known Julian Ashton Art School.

He spoke passionately about doing things well. For example, rebuilding a Harley Davidson from scratch, which took 4 years, cost \$90K and was approached by the Powerhouse Museum, Sydney who picked it up yesterday to put this unique bike on display for all to see and admire.

Angie's Angle.....

Pauline Gleeson's talk 18 Sept 2014 - ASHA to NEPAL

Asha means 'hope' in Nepali – but more than that Asha has changed lives.

Pauline Gleeson, Rotary Club of Moruya, is also the President of the Asha Foundation and part of an Australian and Nepalese team dedicated to improving the lives of disadvantaged children in Nepal. The Asha Foundation projects provide sanitation, access to water and quality education to impoverished villagers and children.

Pauline chose last night to speak about the Matching Grant project totalling US \$12,650 which has radically changed the living conditions of a poverty stricken village called Kuntabesi nestled in the mountains near Kathmandu. She said all credit goes to Derek Anderson, President of Rotary Club of Moruya who agreed, about 4 years ago, to take up the challenge and go into partnership with The Rotary International Foundation, Rotary Club of Dillibazaar in Kathmandu and the Asha Foundation to collaborate on projects there. Work was done in stages over this period and allowances made for the heavy monsoonal rains.

The transformation visible on many fronts was truly wonderful. For example, the disabled school now has a proper toilet block easily accessible right by the classrooms. Importantly, the 'team' asked the school headmaster what was needed rather than impose our western perceptions. The village has no electricity, no running water and conditions at the schools were dark and dingy. Now with the water project, tanks have been setup and for the first time ever the children can turn on a tap – an amazing impact. The school wished for a fence and got their wish! Another wish fulfilled was the cement rendering of a main building and all within a tight budget.

Pauline's passion is palpable! Dignitaries have visited the place, Rotary plaques are on buildings and the Light of Rotary shines brighter than ever, reflected in the eyes of the villagers and all who participated in this humanitarian work.
