Our Youth Scholarship night

Tonight we welcome the recipient of this year's Narooma Rotary Tertiary Scholarship Carl McEvoy. Carl will study for a Bachelor of Media at Macquarie University.

We also welcome back Connor Ross, last year's recipient, who had a gap year last year and is now ready to start a Bachelor of Arts (Music Industry) at the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology. Our Club awards a three-year scholarship to a student from Narooma High School each year, thanks to a bequest by Alexander Birch.

Mr Birch only lived in Narooma a short time but wanted to help our local young people achieve their dreams. He liked Narooma Rotary's involvement with our youth and so entrusted the administration of the scholarship to our Club.

Through his bequest, Narooma Rotary has now helped 25 students from Narooma High pursue their tertiary studies – assistance that totals over \$210,000.

Rotary donates defibrillator

Narooma Rotary Club has purchased a defibrillator for the Narooma community. It is located at Narooma Plaza just inside Woolworths entrance.

'Sudden cardiac arrest is the main cause of death in Australia and can strike anyone,' said local paramedic Mark Jolly.

'The first four minutes are vital, that's well before an ambulance can respond. For every minute that passes, the chance of survival reduces by 10%.

'A shock to the heart from a defibrillator is the only definitive treatment so having one on hand can save a life.

'Defibrillators these days are easy to use and maintain, require no training and the machine talks the operator through it.'

Mr Jolly thanked Narooma Rotary, Narooma Plaza management and Woolworths for their initiative, adding that this is the first defibrillator in Narooma available for general use.

Narooma Plaza manager Mark Anderson said it provided added safety for the community.

The defibrillator cost \$2,400.

Narooma Rotary project coordinator Chris O'Brien said Rotary hopes to purchase more defibrillators in the future.

Other defibrillators in the district are located at Club Narooma, Club Dalmeny and Narooma Golf Club.
