What a memorable dinner and talk 30 Rotarians from Bega and Narooma enjoyed at Bermagui Country Club last night. A great way to connect socially each year with members of Bega Rotary which sponsored the Charter of our Club way back in 1958.

Guest speaker, Rolf Kruit gave a riveting talk on the vital role played by NSW Health Emergency & Aeromedical Service. As a senior Aeromedical Operations Officer at the Control Centre, Sydney, he and a team get to monitor a huge array of technology across the State to respond immediately to any emergency that arises. The Aeromedical Service provides operational and clinical assistance, air rescue, patient care and emergency aeromedical support to multiple State & Federal Services, Clinicians, Military, State and Interstate Emergency Services.

A fleet of aircraft – fixed wing and helicopters are specially equipped as air ambulances and operate in conjunction with NSW Ambulance and the Royal Flying

Doctor Service. Five large Beechcraft King Air planes are based in Sydney; 2 additional King Air aircraft are at Dubbo. Rural and Metropolitan NSW are well covered by a complex interlinking web of technology and emergency systems.

Flight teams are highly selected. Doctors are senior registrars, paramedics are senior Intensive Care Officers as well as nursing staff, top pilots with broad operational experience. *(Many have previously flown Black Hawks in the military).*

Rolf mentioned a few of many traumas/emergencies which they have responded to. eg: 1992 – Thredbo landslide, 2002 – Bali bombing at Sari Club, 2004 – Tsunami, Indonesia, 2011 Queensland flood, 2011 – Japan earthquake & tsunami, 2015 – Lindt café/Sydney.

Impressive? You bet – we all felt we were in very safe hands in the event of an accident or disaster.

**As thanks, the certificate to Rolf reads, 'In recognition of your visit to us, our Clubs will each immunise ten children against polio by donating to the Rotary End Polio Now program.'**
