### Thursday 4 June 2015: Dr Alan Fridley's talk: The Past, Present & Future of Veterinarian Medicine



**"It's been a strange, strange, wonderful life"**. This comment to me by our charming guest speaker Alan seemed to sum up a life filled with amazing insights and rich experiences from time he graduated in Vet Science, University of Qld, followed by his post-graduate internship University of California at Davis, USA, 1973.

Alan and his long time local **Vet-to-Pet Mobile Veterinary Service** needed no introduction many of us with pets. He has a wonderful caring and personalised approach and a great interest in the role animals play in people's lives. He's enjoyed quite a history with Rotary from the mid 1980's when he travelled around the world extensively as a diagnostic vet, enjoying fellowship with many Rotarians in communities along the way.

He chose tonight's theme to share traditional diagnoses and treatments of animal diseases and look into the future at new frontiers in treatments just 10-15 years from now. Interesting diseases touched on which may also be transmitted to humans were Swine Flu, the Borna disease known as the Hendra virus and Anthrax found in cattle country eg Dubbo/Wagga. In the past, dogs especially were subject to distemper and Hydatid resulting in neurological fits and cysts in lungs respectively. Nowadays with medicines available these are quite curable. Many other diseases he said have not been paid enough attention to and are *'sleeping giants - ripe ready to explode.'*

These days if a horse breaks a leg it can be saved with an orthotic limb compared with in the past when it would have been euthanised. He talked about horse dentistry and how sophisticated specialised it is today. Dental work on dogs and cats and curing abscesses gives them a new lease on life. Cancer therapy/chemo is also applied extensively now to pets with great results.

Alan closed his fascinating talk saying **'the future is here'**. A paradigm shift with a movement called *'One Medicine'* is gestating where all health professionals will join together in a unified effort to diagnose humans and animals holistically. Genetic scans will play a major part. Alan spoke of the role of the ancient healing art of acupuncture, meridians and pulse diagnoses and its influence. **Truly Back to the Future!**
